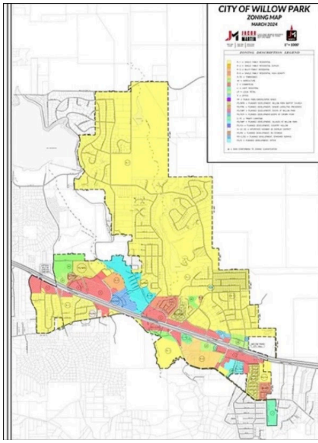

Ted Cruz is one of two senators who represent the state of Texas in the U.S. Senate.



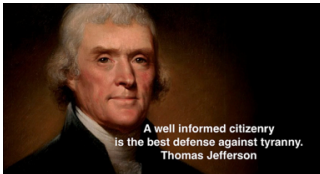
TX House Olcott: Banning In-state tuition for illegal Aliens, Feds had to step in.
